MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI



Parting the Darkness
Goodness gracious, this is the April
bulletin! Which means that this is the
last month of Bat Yam's formal
season and your rabbi will soon be
pointing her RV westward for the
summer. Where has the time
gone?!!?

And, this year, April also means Passover. This is a Jewish leap year, so Passover is "late" on our secular calendar: the first Seder is Friday night, April 22. You'll find all the information on our congregational Seder that night elsewhere in this bulletin.

Among the many "highlights" of our Passover Seder is the recitation of the Ten Plagues, those terrible punishments brought down upon the Egyptian people as their leader, Pharaoh, stubbornly refused to let the Israelites go. While we celebrate our liberation, we mourn – by diminishing the contents of our wine glass – that others had to suffer for us to be set free.

The Biblical wording of the next-to-thelast plague interests me. We know, of course, that the last plague - death to the first-born Egyptian sons – was the most terrible. We might imagine, then, that the 9th plague - darkness upon the land of Egypt - would be something nearly as awful. Yet darkness doesn't really seem so bad. Sure, the Egyptians might have bumped around a lot. In fact, the text tells us that "for three days no one could get up from where s/he was." But, still, that doesn't seem so ghastly bad. Surely not by comparison to the death of one's child, but even not so bad in comparison to locusts and hail and dead cattle and some of the other earlier plagues.

Perhaps the text gives us a clue to the horror of this penultimate plague when it tells us that within this Godimposed deep darkness "People could not see one another." The plague of darkness, it turns out, made real relationship impossible. It is the Egyptian community's isolation, one from another, that is, I think, the deep tragedy of this plague.

As our last full month of the season winds down, I reflect upon a *Bat Yam* community that has this year been truly vibrant. That vibrancy has certainly been about all manner of programs and worship and study and other activities. But the greatest strength of our congregation is when we truly see one another and, in seeing, we come together as a community of caring and support, of joy and sorrow.
